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## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Comprehensive Health Research Centre (CHRC) is a new, national centre of excellence providing a unifying environment for innovation and education in public health, lifestyles, nursing, rehabilitation, and clinical research.

CHRC gathered in 2023 a total of 220 integrated PhD Researchers, 128 PhD students, and 55 integrated non-PhD researchers and technicians. CHRC grew in the number of people involved, presenting an increase of 15,8% in integrated PhD researchers and 16.4% in PhD students.

Regarding scientific impact indicators in 2023, CHRC presented a total of 540 publications. More than a half of this number (304) are scientific articles published in high-impact journals.

The CHRC PhD integrated researchers are involved, as principal investigators or participants, in 108 national and international projects, equivalent globally to 80M €.

Integrated members of the CHRC are involved with several networks and working groups, as well as been performing numerous activities initiatives, actions, and activities in collaboration with international consortia, at European and global levels, related to all CHRC thematic lines.

In 2023, CHRC researchers keep and improved their participation civil societies or scientific organizations, carried out many activities that contribute to disseminating scientific knowledge in civil society, and provided services to the community.

CHRC has defined its strategy around three main strings: platforms for technical and administrative assistance, platforms for scientific support and training, and annual structural initiatives. In 2023 all these initiatives were in place and fulfilling their mission supporting CHRC researchers and is promoting the enhancement of collaborative and interdisciplinary research for better outcomes in health.

CHRC is committed to producing innovative, preventive, and treatment strategies and healthcare delivery based on robust evidence to improve individual and public health, around five principal fields, each comprising the following subthemes:

#### Executive and management office

Aims: To manage day-to-day operations, coordinate and manage technical and administrative teams; control costs; prepare regular performance reports; supervise communication and dissemination initiatives and implement best management practices; develop and disseminate the Unit's strategy and mission to all members and technical and administrative teams, and promote fundraising.


In addition to the objectives described above, during 2023 this department participated in the preparation, implementation and later submission of the new application for the Multiannual Programme for Financing R&D Units 2023/2024 of the Fundação para a Ciência e a Tecnologia (FCT).

#### Funding office

Aim: To boost researchers fundraising by helping them to know and prepare proposals for applying for national, international, and structural funding.

The Funding Office (FO) was created to help CHRC researchers fundraise for their projects, by increasing their chances to get highly competitive R&D funding, either at the national or international level, in all the thematic lines of CHRC.

In 2023 the Funding Office (FO) continued to support researchers in their project applications. This year CHRC support 98 applications for funding, 18 national and 80 international: 21 approved, 46 not approved and 31 in evaluation process.



Considering the 9 national applications approved, four were financed by FCT, I.P, one by Fundação Calouste Gulbenkian, one by Instituto Português do Desporto e Juventude I.P, one by Programa Ciência Viva no Laboratório - Ocupação Científica de Jovens nas Férias, one by Merck Sharp & Dohme - Prémio MSD de Investigação em Saúde 2023 and another one by the Portuguese Ministry of Health.

Regarding the 12 international applications approved, 10 were financed by the European Commission, 1 by the European Food and Safety Authority and another one by the European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control (ECDC).

Considering the needs of CHRC members, in 2023 CHRC contributed to scientific dissemination by conducting eight activities. These included the presentation of the session titled "Untangling Funding Applications for European Opportunities: Brainstorming of Ideas, Management, and Consortia" held in February at the University of Évora, and a presentation at the Eugénio de Almeida Foundation, sponsored by the Alzheimer Foundation, focusing on European funding for mental health initiatives. Additionally, CHRC coordinated the production of six videos showcasing various internal projects under the CHRC Research Grants program.

Furthermore, during 2023, CHRC played a key role in organizing scientific events, hosting one international event and participating in the organization of two other international events and one national event. The international event organized by CHRC was the fourth edition of the Comprehensive Health Research Centre Annual Summit. Additionally, CHRC contributed to organizing the International Seminar on Technology in Sport and the International Congress of the International Graphonomics Society (IGS),

held at the University of Évora, as well as a national event titled 'Mental Health of Higher Education Students,' aimed at raising awareness about the importance of promoting mental health.

#### Communication office

Aims: To ensure the communication and dissemination of information between the management units of CHRC, and all external stakeholders – partners and peers form scientific community, as well as civil society (initiated in 2023); to provide visual support (image and video) for various initiatives, delivering a strong and attractive image to the targeted public.

#### INTRODUCTION

In 2023, compared to 2022, there was a sharp increase in requests for support from the CHRC Communication, allowing for the maximization of the dissemination of CHRC investigators' work, achievements, and events. Furthermore, the Communication Office expanded its focus from primarily internal communication to also actively engaging with civil society. This expansion aims to enhance public understanding of science and health and to keep citizens informed about developments in health research in Portugal. To achieve this, the language was simplified, and additional channels were opened, such as CHRC's monthly newsletter, to ensure that ordinary citizens have access to information.

In line with CHRC's expansion on social media to further disseminate its mission, new platforms were introduced to engage a wider audience. Consequently, an Instagram account and a YouTube channel were launched, reaching 531 and 263 individuals, respectively. Moreover, by the conclusion of December 2023, the Instagram account had amassed 132 followers, while the YouTube channel had garnered 56 subscribers and 157 streaming views.

A new initiative, known as 'CHRC Talks,' was launched by a team of CHRC researchers. Its primary objective was to foster interaction and scientific exchange among CHRC members, with the aim of enhancing collaboration networks, including the efforts of all CHRC Research Groups. As an internal initiative, its target audience comprised researchers within the Centre.

The CHRC Communication office also gave support in several events. The most important events that required full attention and presence were the 4th CHRC Annual Summit and IGS2023. Support was provided in various areas, including website management (such as news updates, abstract submissions, and program details), creation of videos and images for the new branding of both editions, and live reporting during these events.

#### Monthly Newsletters

In 2023, the monthly Newsletter comprised two editions: the primary edition for integrated members and another for CHRC collaborators and subscribers of the CHRC Newsletter. The second edition was released on the same day, featuring content focused on the latest news from CHRC, enabling collaborators and subscribers to stay updated on the center's progress and initiatives. The newsletters included information about opportunities/events open to the general public, as well as publications by CHRC researchers. Throughout the year, the list of subscriptions on the website steadily increased, reaching 30 subscriptions by the end of 2023. A total of 11 CHRC Newsletters were sent.

#### Internal and Events communications

Besides the Newsletter, 73 internal email communications were sent for the list of integrated members of our Centre. As dissemination requests grew rapidly throughout the year and as Communication has strict rules regarding the number of internal Communications to be sent to avoid spam or lack of interest on the part of integrated members, it was necessary to filter the topics in order of importance. All emails are identified by categories: [Information], [Important information], [Opportunities], [SAVE THE DATE], [Action needed].

In terms of disseminating events and initiatives, a total of 21 communications were sent out, with the primary highlights being the 4th CHRC Annual Summit and the International Graphonomics Society.

#### - CHRC TALKS

CHRC TALKS was an initiative from several researchers from the Comprehensive Health Research Centre, with the aim to promote interaction and scientific sharing among CHRC members, with a view to strengthening collaborative networks.

The CHRC Talks premiered on June 30, 2023, and subsequently occurred once a month on Fridays, totalling 6 sessions in an online format. Each session was hosted in rotation by one of the CHRC Research Groups, which comprise 21 groups belonging to the 5 thematic lines of CHRC.

These sessions had a free format and included presentations and discussion of projects in competitions/applications for funding and showcases of projects from CHRC thematic lines. Furthermore, an exclusive section of CHRC Talks was launched on the CHRC's website. This section disseminated information about the dates, themes, and summaries of each internal talk, and provided streaming access for visitors.

#### Overview of online communications

In 2023, a total of 560 online communications were published through the CHRC's website and social media channels. This total includes repeated dissemination across multiple channels, with 173 of these communications containing unique content.

- CHRC News: 140 news items were published, including information about awarded, funded, and ongoing projects, partnerships and consortia, high-impact research publications, highlights of CHRC events, interviews about CHRC projects/work, "SAVE THE DATE" notices, and significant achievements by CHRC researchers.
- Events: 21 events were promoted, such as the 4th CHRC Annual Summit, CHRC Talks, IGS2023, and various international and national seminars, webinars, and workshops on health-related topics like challenges, digital tools and innovation, the impact of external factors and policies, etc.
- Opportunities: 12 training opportunities were advertised, including CHRC and other institutions' grants (e.g., CHRC Grant - Call for Financial and Logistic Support for the Organization of Training Activities: regulation available on the CHRC website: CHRC Website), invitations to significant international and national conferences


and events, special issue opportunities, calls for papers, work submissions, and training sessions.

#### CHRC website


The CHRC website is an important platform to centralize all news content and information about the Research Centre, its structure, its mission and all its research work.

To optimize the numbers of visitors on the website, Communication department kept it updated with fresh content and news, using keywords related to the main target (research institutions and professionals) with the aim of increasing traffic on the website through organic search and sharing its content on the social media networks to facilitate the "spread the word" concept. Also, every month was released a set of news about the centre through the Newsletter that redirects the readers to the complete information on the website. The success of this strategy was confirmed by the increase in website traffic - a marked growth of 43% compared to 2022 in visits/followers on the website. Additionally, the CHRC website was primarily accessed through organic search (search engines), with an increase of 7% compared to 2022, followed by direct search (access to direct URLs shared on social media channels and articles shared by partners/media). In terms of visitor location, Portugal leads with over 12,000 users accessing the website through a Portuguese IP address. Following closely are Spain, with numbers nearly matching those of the USA, Brazil, China, the United Kingdom, Germany, France, and Italy, ranking as the 8th top countries for website visits, totaling over 1,000 users.

#### CHRC on Social Media

In 2023, despite a 16% decrease in overall social media reach, CHRC observed an increase in interactions. The increased of CHRC website visits and the expansion to Instagram and Youtube contributed to this, bolstering the existing social media presence. Additionally, CHRC's social channels experienced a remarkable 46% growth in follower count.

However, there was a notable decline in reach on Facebook, possibly due to the platform's preference for professional accounts with advertising investment. Moreover, a significant migration of followers to platforms like Instagram likely contributed to the decline. Twitter's transition to Social Network X also resulted in a decrease in active accounts and loss of reach. To overcome these challenges and stabilize social media reach, CHRC must implement new approaches and creative strategies.



#### **CONCLUSIONS**

- CHRC continues to grow on online platforms and keep gaining a good position in search engines;
- Although reach was compromised in 2023, we saw a marked growth in visits/followers on the website (+43% than in 2022) and on social channels (+46%);
- There has been a sharp increase in requests for support and collaboration from CHRC researchers, whether in terms of initiatives, events or even news;
- In 2023, the Communications Office officially began engaging with civil society by offering subscriptions to the CHRC Newsletter. However, much work remains to be done, considering the distinct communication strategies required for research audiences compared to those for the general public;
- Communication was involved in three organizing committees, providing support in organization and communication – 4th CHRC Annual Summit, IGS2023 and CHRC Talks.

#### **FUTUTE IMPROVEMENTS**

- More availability for the Communication Office to look for resources to create and implement new strategies, initiatives and test new support platforms;
- Invest in support platforms to make the workflow more fluid, which may involve dedicating more time and/or improving time management;
- Implement future changes to the website, both to accommodate the new structures
  of the next stage of the CHRC and to optimize and facilitate the discovery of important
  information for visitors.

#### Centre of training and education

Aims: To support the creation of teaching and advanced training opportunities for researchers and students at the CHRC.

The Education and Training (E&T) Office is a specialized office at CHRC. First, it aims is to build a community of practice among CHRC members. Second, it aims to create opportunities for lifelong development of CHRC members. Third, it supports the development of innovative, competitive post-graduate training programmes, streamlining the cooperation among involved institutions and international institutions. In 2023, the core team consisted of Sílvia Lopes (ENSP), Jorge Bravo (UÉvora) and Bruno Heleno (NMS, who coordinated) with the close support of the CHRC Executive Director Rute Sousa and from Nadiya Bocharova who provides clerical support.

#### Main activities

- Following a training needs assessment survey that was emailed to CHRC researchers' and staff, the E&T Office developed the following training actions in 2023:
  - Training in Teamwork and conflict management (June 28, 2023). This was a 4 hours' course (4 hours of contact, 0 hours of autonomous work), without formal summative assessment, organized by Raquel Santos. Twenty-five (25) students successfully completed the online course.
- In 2023, the E&T launched a call for "Financial and logistic support to the organisation of training activities". This initiative aimed at empowering CHRC members to organise seminars, workshops and conferences within topics relevant for CHRC thematic lines.
  - Six applications were received, five were selected for funding and four took place (due to unforeseen circumstances of several key presenters, one did not take place).
  - Interoception: Advanced assessment and intervention in health (September 19, 2023): this workshop invited Prof. Cynthia Price (Washington University; Center for Mindful Body Awareness) and there were 21 participants. The WS included roundtables for the discussion and feedback to CHRC's research projects.
  - International Graphonomics Society 2023 Conference (IGS23) (October 17-19, 2023). This was a conference dedicated to research and practice of fine motor control of the hand. The programme included sessions of feedback to CHRC's researchers' projects and "scientific dates" to foster

- collaboration between CHRC's and international researchers. There were 57 participants.
- Systematic Reviews and Meta-analysis workshop (November 29, 2023) was a workshop about advanced methods in systematic reviews. The session included lectures by Tom Looney (Mohammed Bin Rashid University of Medicine and Health Sciences, UAE) and Susanna Lagorio (Department of Oncology and Molecular Medicine, Instituto Superiore di Sanità, Rome, Italy). There was also hands-on practice with dedicated software for systematic reviews. Finally, there were presentations of CHRC research projects and networking sessions. This workshop had 9 participants.
- Pets as Sentinels of Human Exposure to Environmental Contaminants (December 15-16, 2023) was a conference discussing research about pets as sources of data about human exposure to environmental contaminants, both in the outdoors and home and the role of pets as promoters of health. The conference included drafting a consensus paper about ONE HEALTH approach as the linchpin of human/pet environmental exposure and training of researchers on epidemiological designs applied to One Health. In the programme, CHRC research was presented and there were several opportunities for networking. There were 39 participants.

#### Main challenges

During 2021, the E&T Office had implemented very little of its action plan. In 2022, with the help of Rute Sousa, the Executive Director, we discussed challenges, barriers, and strategies to overcome them. This helped the Office to plan, organize, coordinate and control training actions in that year based on the results of a survey to CHRC members. In 2023, the scope of training activities was broadened with the call for "Financial and logistic support to the organisation of training activities". This call allowed to organise training that was relevant to CHRC research groups and reinforced the internationalization strategy of CHRC. This partially addressed one of the challenges identified in our previous report – the low participation of CHRC members in training actions.

The current challenges faced by the training office include a lower –than expected number of applications for the Call.

#### Methods and data analysis office

Aims: To assist with quantitative and qualitative methods of data analysis.

The area dedicated to **quantitative methods** within the Methods and Data Analysis Office of the CHRC developed the following activities in 2023:

- Support for Research Projects: Provided validation and analysis of quantitative data for CHRC research projects, resulting in the writing and revising of manuscripts, reports, and books and contributing to publishing articles.
- **II.** Event Participation: Disseminated CHRC projects at events, including those organized by the National School of Public Health, NOVA University of Lisbon.
- III. Training Activities: Conducted training on designing and implementing quantitative studies and validating and cleaning health data in the Homogeneous Diagnosis Groups database. These activities led to one oral presentation, one abstract submission for an international conference, and one article in preparation.
- IV. Biostatistical Techniques: Various biostatistical techniques were applied using R, SPSS, and JAMOVI software. Techniques included data preparation, validation, cleaning, descriptive analysis, bivariate analysis (t-tests, ANOVA, correlation, chi-square), multivariate analysis and modeling (generalized linear models, distributed lag non-linear models, excess mortality and morbidity estimation), and factor analysis (exploratory and confirmatory).
- V. Collaborations in projects.
- VI. Climate Change and Health: Participation in activities related to the impact of climate change on health, including literature review and data analysis.

The area dedicated to **qualitative methods** within the Methods and Data Analysis Office of the CHRC developed the following activities in 2023:

- Support in teaching the Course on Advanced Research Methodologies I for the PhD in Health and Wellbeing Sciences and Technologies.
- 2. Methodological support for various projects (e.g., Organizational Health Literacy Responsiveness for Diabetes Care; LOng Covid Understanding Symptoms, events and use of services in Portugal (LOCUS); Capabilities, Opportunities, Places and Engagement (COPE); Leading the Way to a Healthy Future, White Paper; Fast Track Cities Cascais), including study design, data collection, data analysis, report writing, scientific manuscripts writing.

- 3. Methodological consultancy for students, including designing and implementing data collection instruments, qualitative data analysis, using qualitative tools for systematic reviews.
- 4. Support in the use and optimization of MaxQDA software, including basic (e.g., importing/exporting data, coding, data synthesis) and advanced use (e.g., data visualization) and selection of best tools to enrich the analysis and reporting.
- 5. Support in the utilization of Taguette software (i.e., importing/exporting data, coding).
- 6. Development of tutorials to support students and researchers using qualitative methods.
- 7. Management of MaxQDA licences.
- 8. Support in projects activities, including moderation in events (e.g., ACAD, PAFSE).

#### Biobank

Aims: to support biomedical research, addressing all its facets, such as prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and monitoring of specific characteristics of a disease.

The Comprehensive Health Biobank (**CHAIN**) is located at NOVA Medical School and is powered by the Comprehensive Health Research Centre (CHRC)research Unit. It is part of Portuguese Roadmap of Research Infrastructures (RNIE) as a member of the National Biobanks Infrastructure (<u>www.biobanco.pt</u>). The full report with the annexes can be consulted <u>here</u>.

Its **main mission** is to provide the most trusted biological samples available (serum, DNA, organoids, bone, cell lines) to support biomedical, clinical, epidemiological, and translational research activities, especially in the areas ofhealth promotion and chronic and high burden diseases, thus allowing to strengthen research quality and outcome as well as encouraging national and international research collaborations.

The specific objectives of this infrastructure are:

- To develop a large-scale biomedical database with a wide range of human samples (solid and fluid) containing health information, globally accessible to approved researchers with the research fields into the most common chronic diseases with a significant impact on public health.
- 2. To collect and process a variety of state-of-the-art samples, usually

- unavailable in most biobanks such as organoids, cell lines and bone.
- To manage, complying with the standard procedures, the existing collections of NMS researchers for use in their research projects and boost their works.

As biomedical research, particularly in precision medicine, advances rapidly, it is crucial for research institutes to invest in robust infrastructures like biobanks. These infrastructures provide a solid foundation for the research community, enabling successful and reliable research outcomes that can be effectively translated back into clinical practice. Thus, leveraging the NMS Research ecosystem and the collaborative efforts of CHRC in 2023, we successfully implemented the CHAIN biobank at NOVA Medical School.

#### I. Chain BIOBANK implementation activities

In the year 2023 CHAIN biobank had a significant investment from Nova Medical school and by creating 3 labs for the biobank: BLS2 biosafety lab; freezers rooms with 3 freezers; sample processing and quality control lab that offer services of DNA and RNA extraction and analysis. by PCR/qPCR. CHAIN also offers services available at NMS, such as cell culture, flow cytometry and microscopy. Furthermore, it was acquired a LIMS software — LabCollector for sample and data management, a bench centrifuge for biological samples and other consumables needed to collect and process the samples expected. The biobank was integrated in the NMS Research Infrastructures (RI) Office to work collaboratively with the other RI that can also provide knowledge and support services. NMS recruited a new CHAIN Biobank Technical Coordinator and nominated a Scientific Committee (annex 1 – full report). With these human resources and with the support and collaboration with the scientific research support structures from NMS we were able to effectively implement the CHAIN biobank at NMS.

In 2023 several activities were developed to effectively implement the chain biobank:

- 1. An internal regulation with CHAIN governance and organogram were developed and approved by NMS board and by CHRC board (Annex 1 <u>full report</u>) All samples and their respective informed consents were stored at 80°C were screened and annotated in the LIMS software. Presently it stores more than 30000 samples from 11000 participants, including blood, serum, plasma, urine and bones (table 1).
- 2. Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) were established to prepare all procedures, from documents management to samples collection, transportation, processing and storage. These SOPs and FORMS were

developed based on the best international practices of ISBER and ISO 20387 for biobanking. These documents are all available and in the internal regulation (annex 1- page 23 table 4 – <u>full report</u>). Furthermore, CHAIN Biobank follows all the current Nacional and International legislation like the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), Law No. 58/2019, of August 8, which transposes Regulation (EU) No. 679/2016, of April 2 and of Law 12/2005, of January 26 for personal genetic information and health information, having approval by the NMS|FCM-UNL Ethics Committee (CEFCM) and the National Data Protection Commission (CNPD).

- 3. A Material Deposit Agreement (MDA) (annex 2 <u>full report</u>), Material Transfer Agreement (MTA) (annex 3 <u>full report</u>) and Informed Consent (annex 4 <u>full report</u>) were prepared and approved in compliance with the just mention ethical and legal regulations.

#### **CHRC Research Grants**

CHRC Research Grants is a yearly initiative awarding collaborative and multidisciplinary projects, with a total endowment of 320.000€;

In 2020, two collaborative projects were awarded with the amount of 40.000€/each. Projects "PROOF- PReventing OsteoporOtic Fractures" and "COVID-19 pandemic: the social distance at the school playground and its effects on children's social-emotional competence and physical activity" are still ongoing ad will be concluded by the end of 2022.

In 2021, three collaborative and multidisciplinary projects proposed by integrated members of the CHRC were awarded the amount of € 80,000. Projects "Reforming the reform: an evidence-based financing model for the Portuguese primary care (REF2PRIM)" - 30.000€; "The effects of whole-body vibration (WBV) on the management of osteoporosis in early menopausal women" - 25.000€; "KneeCare@Home: Home exercise-based rehabilitation program following surgical reconstruction of the anterior cruciate ligament" - 25.000€.

In 2022, eight collaborative and multidisciplinary projects proposed by integrated members of the CHRC were awarded the amount of € 20,000/each. The call for

proposals was launched in October, with a specific regulation that can be consulted. The jury was composed of 4 elements external to the R&D unit. The results were as follows:

- 1<sup>st</sup> The COGCARE Project Cognitive disorders and impact on caregivers 20.000€;
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Self-care in the person with chronic disease 20.000€;
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Multimorbidity in Primary healthcare: developing an intervention to support patients and primary healthcare clinicians to better manage complex multimorbidity 20.000€;
- 4<sup>th</sup> Advancing Digital Health Behavior Change Precision: Development of a framework of personalization of behavior change techniques 20.000€;
- 5<sup>th</sup> <u>HE@RT.FIT</u> Sustainability of traditional and live-streaming exercise-based cardiac rehabilitation in low-risk patients with cardiovascular disease 20.000€;
- 6<sup>th</sup> Improving physical function in older adults: exploring the interaction between protein intake and physical activity 20.000€;
- 7<sup>th</sup> HERO: Impact of Artificial Habitats and Environmental contaminants on Chronic RespiratOry Diseases 20.000€;
- 8<sup>th</sup> Assessing Risk from exposure To Environmental contaminants in Portuguese Mother-Infant pairS 20.000€.

No grants were awarded in 2023 because the funding allocated for project grants had already been distributed. The decision to award grants only until 2022 was made strategically, considering the need for time to implement and execute the projects.

#### **CHRC Annual Summit**

Aims: enhancing communication between members and management units to boost and promote clinical, public health, and health services research of a collaborative and multidisciplinary character.

The fourth CHRC Annual Summit took place face-to-face in Évora on the 25th and 26th of May, 2023, joining 162 CHRC members on both days. Six distinguished speakers presented four high-level keynote speeches. Of the submitted scientific works, 31 oral communications were also presented, with the works best quoted by the Scientific Committee of the event, 38 posters were exhibited and more than 24kg of the leftover food was given to Refood, as the CHRC Annual Summit, in addition to health, is committed to sustainability and the fight against waste. #### Financial support for scientific publication

CHRC financially support the payment of the papers' publication costs with the main objective of stimulating the scientific production of the integrated members. The general guidelines for this support regarding authorship and affiliation are that the body of authors must include, at least, two integrated members of the CHRC; Or the body of authors must include only one integrated member of the CHRC, within an international consortium of authors; The first or last author of the article should be a full member of the CHRC. Regarding the scientific journals, the article must be published in Q1 or Q2 journals in their respective areas.

In 2023, NOVA Medical School supported the payment of 11 paper publications, National School of Public Health supported 20 and Évora University supported 22.

#### **CHRC PhD scholarships**

CHRC PhD scholarships (15 positions) within CHRC management institutions and thematic lines, funded by FCT, IP. So far, a total of 15 PhD scholarships was awarded to PhD students included in different doctoral programmes: Doctoral Programme in Public Health, Global Public Health, Health Sciences, Human Kinetics, and Health and Wellbeing Sciences and Technologies. One PhD student dropped out of her PhD, and the CHRC was unable to re-allocate the respective scholarship. thus, there are 14 awarded PhD scholarships whose study plans are ongoing.


## 2. CHRC PEOPLE





Up to December 2023, CHRC gathered a total of 220 integrated PhD Researchers, 128 PhD students, and 55 integrated non-PhD researchers and technicians. In addition, as a result of the potential and work developed within CHRC, 102 researchers, integrated in other national research units, joined the CHRC as collaborating members.

A comparison exercise between the December 2022 and December 2023 shows that CHRC grew in number of people involved, presenting an increase of 15,8% in integrated PhD researchers and 16,4% in the number of PhD students.

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






Research projects' total funding is distributed by source of funding as follows:



This report was elaborated based on information collected from 121 questionnaires on the scientific indicators filled by CHRC integrated members. This questionnaire was launched by email in 13<sup>th</sup> May. For the purposes of the management report, data received up to 24<sup>th</sup> May was considered. The research support services of all management institutions were also consulted, with respect to applications prepared, projects funded, and scientific publications.

This report was delivered in 06<sup>th</sup> August, 2024. The delay in delivering this year's management report was dued to the fact that the management team and executive committee were extensively occupied with the preparation of the CHRC proposal for the period 2025-2029, which required significant time and resources.
